UKCA (UK Conformity Assessed) marking Delayed until 1 January 2023



This was **due to be implemented** on **1 Jan 2022** for most goods being placed on the UK market, that **previously required the CE marking**. Businesses can **continue to use the CE marking** until the **1st January 2023**

NEW AHR EHCs for POAO delayed from 21 August 2021 to 15 January 2022

New Animal Health Regulation (AHR) Export Health Certificates (EHCs) will need to be used for all **products of Animal Origin, Live Animals, germinal products & Composite Products** exported to the EU from 15 January 2022. **Current EHCs signed before 15 Jan 2022 can be used until 15 Mar 2022 for goods on route** to the EU.

Movement of Goods From GB to NI: TSS UPDATES

[Apply for authorisation for the UK Trader Scheme if you bring goods into Northern Ireland - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](https://www.gov.uk)

From **1 November 2021** you must be an **Authorised Trader** to **declare** goods **"Not at Risk"**. The **existing waiver** in place **may not be extended** so businesses receiving goods from GB must ensure they are registered to **avoid potential duties**.

From **1 January 2022 full frontier declarations (FFD)** using TSS will be required before goods move. **Presently the ENS (Entry Summary Declaration) & The Simplified Declaration (SFD)** is all that is required with the Supplementary being completed later. FFD's enables you to complete all your customs declarations processes, **ENS, SFD & Supplementary in one go** with all duties and taxes also collected before the goods arrive at their import destination.

GB IMPORT Regulation from 1 October 2021:

From **1 October to 31 December**, Products of Animal Origin, Animal By-Products, and High-Risk Foods Not of Animal Origin being imported from the European Union (EU) into Great Britain (GB) can **continue to arrive at any point of entry**, and there is **no requirement to attend a Border Control Post**. This is a **temporary measure** until 1 January 2022
